CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Breathing Out of the Box.

I've heard people use the term "not a care in the world". I understand in principle what the phrase means. But I don't think I've experienced a single day in my life since I turned sixteen years old that I didn't have some care or concern on my mind. It seems like the older I get, the more concerns I have.

Here lately, life has been particularly tense and stressful. We all have stages in our lives where it seems like the pressures on us feel overwhelming. I want to share a strategy I have recently implemented in my life to help me deal with the anxiety I feel. It's called box breathing.

Box breathing was developed as a form of yoga. It has since been used by many people of all walks of life including the US Navy Seals. The practice of box breathing is rather simple.

First, if able, you should find a comfortable seated position. Trace in your mind a one-dimensional square box. As you imagine going up the first side of the box, inhale through your nose for a count of four. As you count in your head, focus on breathing deeply. Then at the top of the box, hold your breath for another count of four. As you go down the other side of the box, exhale through your mouth for a count of four. Finally, at the bottom of the box, hold your breath for a count of four. Repeat these steps for as long as you like. It can be as short as 1 minute or as long as you want.

I have found this simple exercise helps me calm my mind and I feel re-centered. My stressors are still there, but I am in a healthier state of mind to deal with them and I no longer feel overwhelmed. At least for a while! When I feel the stress again, I go back to my box.

God never promised us that life would be easy. Sometimes we forget that he has called us to come to him with our anxiety because he cares for us. Box breathing is a technique that can help us calm down enough to remember that. Give it try. Peace is not far off.
